

Anti-Bullying Program for STUDENT-ATHLETES

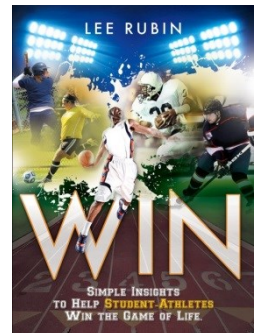
